- 1. On the first day Dr Dhananjay Jhurry, Hon'ble Chief Guest of the inaugural ceremony virtually inaugurated the Two-day International Conference on 'Environmental Issues Global Warming: Reasons and Remedies'
- 2. Hon'ble Chairperson Dr Raju Deshmukh and the guest of honour Dr S.C. Gulhane were also prominently present.

It's released when oil, coal, and other fossil fuels are burned for energy—the energy we use to power our homes, cars, and smartphones. By using less of it, we can curb our own contribution to climate change while also saving money.

- 2. Dr Ramendra Prasad in his talk said that Climate change is the gravest threat to the sustainable livelihoods, wellbeing, viability, security, and sovereignty of Pacific Small Island Developing States
 - 3. Dr Rajkumar Khapekar remarked that the climate of small island states is influenced by extremely low levels of greenhouse gas emissions, means that they will suffer disproportionately from the damaging impacts of climate change.

Session – 2

- 2. Dr A. Mangala De'Zoysa in his talk explained that climate resilience is often associated with acute events like heat waves, heavy downpours, hurricanes, or wildfires that will become more frequent or intense as the climate changes.
- 3. Dr Yogesh Bhute summed up the session explaining that Climate change is a global phenomenon that largely impacts urban life and further suggested to support small agricultural producers and to promote green energy. Further he said Reduce, Reuse, Recycle. Reduce waste by choosing reusable products instead of disposables. .. Increase forest cover, restore sea grasses and boost use of agricultural cover crops to reduce the amount of CO2 in atmosphere.


