- Material is presented in short phrases rather than full paragraphs.
- Bulleted lists help them organize ideas
- Verbal explanations of pictures/graphs help more than written clarifications
- Relevant pictures are used.
- Don't use templates with too many colors.

Mr Sudhir Agarmore explained the details functioning and steps of how to create virtual classroom. He advised all the faculties to use Electa software for online teaching and training. He said, it is a state-of-the-art Virtual Classroom Software and a Learning Management System for Online Courses and Live Online Classes by anyone at anywhere.
